

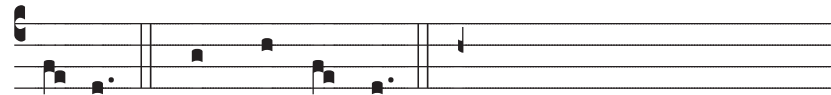
Hail, true Body, truly born
