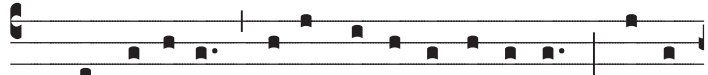

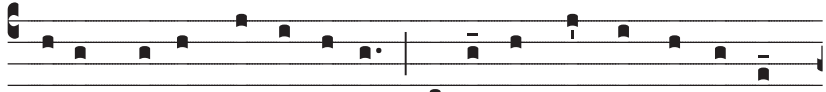

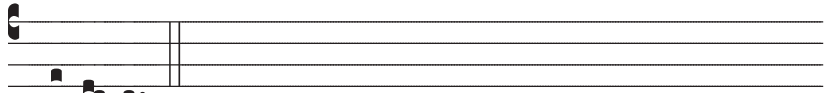

 armies and fleets matched against each other.
 Survey the various ranks of the community,
 its parties and their contests,
 the strivings of the ambitious,

 the grave.

What is the measure ?
 the Cross.

Go again to the world of intellect and science :
 consider the wonderful discoveries
 which the human mind is making,
 the varieties of arts

one God for ever and ever.

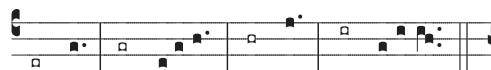
