

The Introit is sung in Latin from the Graduale Romanum, 1974, p. 405. The verses of Psalm 44 are sung in English, Mode 1.

Verse 1

rious is the king's daugh-ter as she en- ters.

Verse 5

I will make your name re-mem-bered through all gen-er-

a-tions ; * therefore shall nations praise you for- ev- er and ev- er.

GLO- RY be to the Fa-ther, and to the Son, and to

the Ho-ly Spir- it. * As it was in the be-gin-ning, is now, and

ev- er shall be, world with- out end. A- men.
