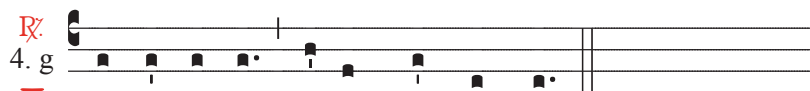

### Psalm 130

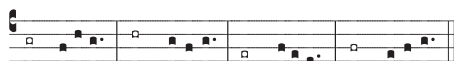
